Attentive to the Word

Twenty-second Sunday after Pentecost Galatíans 6: 11-18 Luke 8: 41-56

Niagara Falls is thundering majesty, awesome beauty, and tremendous power --- all in one. Plunging down hundreds of feet, it pours forth thousands and thousands of kilowatts of energy to give light and life to cities, factories, and farms.

Faith is like Niagara. With far superior beauty and power, it healed hopeless diseases, consoled the suffering, strengthened the alcoholic, saved the sinner, and advanced the cause of truth and justice in the world. Countless miracles throughout the centuries are witnesses to the power of faith by people who really believe in Christ.

Today's Gospel tells us of two such miracles. The first deals with the healing of a woman with an incurable hemorrhage; the second with the resurrection of the daughter of the ruler of a synagogue.

Faith is a hundred times more powerful than Niagara. It will remain long after Niagara becomes a trickle. The energy and power of faith is ours to use whenever needed. But that faith must be real.

A tightrope walker crossed the Niagara from the American to the Canadian side on a suspended wire. He then began to push a wheelbarrow with a grooved wheel across the suspended wire. He received thunderous applause from the people. The performer then asked a boy in the audience if he believed that he could put someone in the wheelbarrow and push him safely to the other side. The boy said "Yes"! When the boy was asked to jump into the wheelbarrow, he ran away. He really didn't believe what he said. He lacked faith.

We are to have faith in the person of Christ. Our power and strength is in Him. He has proven His love for us with the supreme sacrifice of His life. It is our turn to show our love, and at the same time, to make use of the tremendous power potential of faith.

FEAST OF THE ARCHANGEL MICHAEL AND ALL THE HEAVENLY HOSTS

The Apostle Paul says that Angels are: spirits in the service of God, sent as servants for the good of those who must receive the heritage of salvation." God has established them as protectors and guides of every nation and people. He charged them to guard those who hope in Him so that nothing harms them and no evil comes near their dwelling. In heaven, they continually see the face of God, sing the Thrice-holy Hymn, intercede for us, and rejoice over a single sinner who is converted. In a word, in serving God, the angels have rendered us so many services that the pages of Holy Scripture are filled with them. This is why the Church, honoring these divine ministers, our intercessors and guardians, today celebrates this synaxis (a coming together to celebrate a feast). The Church recalls in particular the names of Saints

Michael and Gabriel because they are related to us by Holy Scripture. The word "Michael" signifies "Who is like God?", and the word "Gabriel," "God is powerful." According to Holy Scripture, the number of angels is infinite, as Daniel saw "thousands upon thousands serve God, and myriads upon myriads stand before Him" (Daniel 7:10). They are divided into nine choirs which are: the Seraphim, Cherubim, Thrones, Dominations, Virtues, Powers, Principalities, Archangels, and Angels.

Mission Statement

Saint John the Baptist Byzantine Catholic Cathedral is a member of the Byzantine Catholic Metropolitan Church of Pittsburgh who through the Holy Spirit is called to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ. As a community and family, we grow in faith and in the image and likeness of God by dedicating ourselves to welcoming, celebrating and caring for all of God's people.

Mysteries of Initiation (Baptism, Chrismation & Eucharist): Must be a registered, active, supporting member of the parish family. Pre-baptism instructions are required. Contact Fr. Andrew to schedule.

<u>Mystery of Crowning:</u> Must be a registered, active, supporting member of the parish family. Must meet with Fr. Andrew before setting date and reserving your banquet hall. Pre-Cana program is required and three sessions with Fr. Andrew. The ceremony will be celebrated according to the prescription of the liturgical book of the Byzantine rite.

Mystery of Reconciliation: Celebrated Saturdays, 4:00 PM - 4:30 PM and upon request.

Mystery of Anointing: Celebrated upon request. Ideally celebrated in Church the Sunday before undergoing any surgical or other medical procedure.

<u>Visitation of the Sick:</u> The parishioners confined to their homes or nursing homes due to health reasons are visited monthly. Also, persons who are hospitalized are visited when Fr. Andrew is notified. It especially is important that a family member contact Fr. Andrew whenever a loved-one is hospitalized.

Funerals: Families of the deceased or the funeral director must contact Fr. Andrew before setting and publishing the day and time of the funeral.

<u>Parish Membership:</u> We welcome anyone to become a parishioner of St. John the Baptist Cathedral Parish. Only those who are registered are considered members of the Parish. When one registers to become a parish member they assume the responsibility of rendering stewardship of time, talent and treasure to this parish family. Worship at this parish is always expected. Registration is done only through the pastor by appointment. The Parish Office should be notified as soon as possible of any change of address within the Parish as well as one's leaving.

Godparent/Sponsor Letters: Must be a registered, active, supporting member of the parish.
