

Attentive to the Word

Twenty-third Sunday after Pentecost Ephesians 2:4-10 Luke 10: 25-37

It often happens that the answer to a problem troubling us is in fact staring us in the face. It's a common experience that we frequently overlook what is most obvious. Or, as it is sometimes put: 'We fail to see the wood for the trees'. We search everywhere for what is in front of our noses.

We have a good example of this truth in the Parable of the Good Samaritan

that we have just heard. The parable is uncomfortably simple. Its message is almost too obvious for us to see – as it was for the lawyer Jesus told it to. He asked Jesus to tell him who his neighbor might be. Probably, he expected some abstract, philosophical discourse. But Jesus would not let him get away that easily. Instead, he is given by way of answer a story that makes it all very concrete. The lawyer agrees that the neighbor is the one 'who took pity on the man who had been set upon'. And then Jesus makes it immediate and personal for the lawyer: 'Go and do the same yourself'.

In many areas of our life, we resist seeing what is most obvious – for example, what it is in ourselves that sets others on edge. To others it may be painfully clear where we fall short in neighborliness, kindness, sensitivity... But we ourselves just don't get it. Often, the truth is really that we do not want to see what it is in ourselves that does not tally with the Christianity we profess.

But if we are willing, even just a bit willing, to have our eyes opened, there is a very simple way forward. It is this: I need to ask myself what it is in others that irritates me; what it is in others that sets me off criticizing them. Because what it is in others that makes me judgmental about them may well be something in myself that I don't at all like! – something that I deeply disapprove of; something in myself that I would much rather not know about, let alone honestly face up to.

NATIVITY (PHILIP'S) FAST

November 15 begins the period of fasting in preparation for the feast of the Birth of Our Lord. Traditionally, this penitential season is called the Philip's Fast, because it begins on November 15, the day after the Feast of St. Philip and 40 days before the Nativity of Our Lord.

During this fast no particular penitential acts are required by law, but the faithful are encouraged to keep this season holy. By tradition Monday, Wednesday, and Friday

are especially observed by abstinence from certain foods, most notably meat. In the very least, you are encouraged to abstain from meat on Fridays.

A period of penance, of course, means more than just abstaining from food. More time should be allowed for prayer, attending pre-Nativity services, and for acts of charity to others.

The "Christmas Spirit" will have a special meaning for believers, especially if our celebration of Christ's birth marks a time of growth in spirit, a permanent improvement in our life of faith and love for others. This holy season, above all, should be a time of kindness and joy, marked by abstinence from hurting others, from deceit, gossip, anger, quarrelling, and all other vices which arise from the tongue. It was also the custom for the faithful to receive the Mystery of Reconciliation during this Fast to purify themselves for the great Feast. You are encouraged to do so.

It may seem difficult to keep this fast today. The pre-Nativity time is a period of merriment and parties. Yet, the Church points to a deeper spiritual meaning of Christmas, that on this day God the Son and Word emptied Himself to take flesh as a man. As St. Paul said, "He made himself poor though He was rich, so that you might become rich by His poverty." (1Corinthians 8:9). This penitential season, then, is an invitation by the Church to humble ourselves in some small way, in imitation of Christ so that we might receive on Christmas Day God's greatest gift – His Only-begotten Son, Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

The second will be celebrated on Sunday, December 18, 2022 @ 3:00 p.m. at St. John the Baptist Church, Lyndora. There will be opportunity for the celebration of the Mystery of Reconciliation. All are invited and encouraged to attend as we prepare for the Feast of the Nativity.

reasons are visited monthly. Also, persons who are hospitalized are visited when Fr. Andrew is notified. It especially is important that a family member contact Fr. Andrew whenever a loved-one is hospitalized.

Funerals: Families of the deceased or the funeral director must contact Fr. Andrew before setting and publishing the day and time of the funeral.

Parish Membership: We welcome anyone to become a parishioner of St. John the Baptist Cathedral Parish. Only those who are registered are considered members of the Parish. When one registers to become a parish member they assume the responsibility of rendering stewardship of time, talent and treasure to this parish family. Worship at this parish is always expected. Registration is done only through the pastor by appointment. The Parish Office should be notified

as soon as possible of any change of address within the Parish as well as one's leaving.
