# Attentive to the Word

Sunday of the Fathers of the 7<sup>th</sup> Ecumenical Council Hebrews 13: 7-16 John 17: 1-13

Among the four holy Gospels and in the writings of Saint Paul as well as the other authors of the New Testament texts, the Gospel selection for this week's observance commemorating the Fathers at the Seventh Ecumenical Council is unique in that it contains the words of a beautiful prayer used by our Lord Himself (John 17:1-18). This prayer was said as Jesus sat at the table in the upper room for the Mystical (Last) Supper and it is a prayer specifically that His followers remain united. It is a powerful petition asking for the holiness of those who were to assume leadership of the Church, and it is framed in the love, which exists between God the Father and His Son.

We know that since Christ established the Church, even from its earliest years, the unity for which he prayed so fervently has often been threatened and ruptured by heresy and schism. Two or the most notable breaks were the separation of West from East in the mid-eleventh century and the (Protestant) Reformation in the 16th century. Other major problems before those times tailed for the leaders of the Church to assemble in council to discuss and settle the arguments over the issues confronting the Church at the time. One such issue was the question of whether or not it is proper to venerate images of Christ, His Blessed Mother, or the Saints.

This controversy became so intensely heated that the Emperor in Constantinople ordered the destruction of such works. Those who perpetrated such deeds were termed iconoclasts, a word formed from the Greek language, meaning "image-breakers". They were very successful in this campaign because they bad the sanction of le-gal authority. This destructive activity went on for about 100 years until a council was convened in the city of Nicaea in the year 787 ruling against the iconoclasts and establishing the doctrine which al-lows the making and veneration of holy images.

Every year on the Sunday following October 10th, our Byzantine Church celebrates a commemoration of the 350 Fathers who assembled in council at Nicaea to settle the question of iconoclasm. In doing so, the Church reminds us of our obligation to seek out the truth and follow it. The prayer of our Lord taken from Saint John's Gospel was not only for the first Church leaders; it was for us as well. We are the beneficiaries of the struggles endured by those who preceded us and who have set the example of remaining faithful to the truths of our holy faith. Our consuming task is not only to learn and believe those truths but more importantly to live them.

The preaching of the apostles and the teaching of the Fathers established in the Church a single and united faith: wherefore, this Church, robed in the truth of a theology inspired by heaven, ex-plains and declares with certitude the great mystery of Christ. (Kontakion of the Divine Liturgy for the Sunday of Nicaea II.)

#### Mission Statement

Saint John the Baptist Byzantine Catholic Cathedral is a member of the Byzantine Catholic Metropolitan Church of Pittsburgh who through the Holy Spirit is called to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ. As a community and family, we grow in faith and in the image and likeness of God by dedicating ourselves to welcoming, celebrating and caring for all of God's people.

**Mysteries of Initiation (Baptism, Chrismation & Eucharist):** Must be a registered, active, supporting member of the parish family. Pre-baptism instructions are required. Contact Fr. Andrew to schedule.

**Mystery of Crowning:** Must be a registered, active, supporting member of the parish family. Must meet with Fr. Andrew before setting date and reserving your banquet hall. Pre-Cana program is required and three sessions with Fr. Andrew. The ceremony will be celebrated according to the prescription of the liturgical book of the Byzantine rite.

**Mystery of Reconciliation**: Celebrated Saturdays, 4:00 PM - 4:30 PM and upon request.

**Mystery of Anointing:** Celebrated upon request. Ideally celebrated in Church the Sunday before undergoing any surgical or other medical procedure.

<u>Visitation of the Sick:</u> The parishioners confined to their homes or nursing homes due to health reasons are visited monthly. Also, persons who are hospitalized are visited when Fr. Andrew is notified. It especially is important that a family member contact Fr. Andrew whenever a loved-one is hospitalized.

**Funerals:** Families of the deceased or the funeral director must contact Fr. Andrew before setting and publishing the day and time of the funeral.

Parish Membership: We welcome anyone to become a parishioner of St. John the Baptist Cathedral Parish. Only those who are registered are considered members of the Parish. When one registers to become a parish member they assume the responsibility of rendering stewardship of time, talent and treasure to this parish family. Worship at this parish is always expected. Registration is done only through the pastor by appointment. The Parish Office should be notified as soon as possible of any change of address within the Parish as well as one's leaving.

**Godparent/Sponsor Letters:** Must be a registered, active, supporting member of the parish.
