Attentive to the Word

Sunday of Meat-fare 1 Corinthians 8:8 - 9:2 Matthew 25: 31 - 46

The third festal Sunday we call Meatfare or the Sunday of the Last Judgment. This Sunday reminds us that we cannot take the forgiveness of God for granted, that the time that we have is for repentance. The time that we have is limited and there is an urgency to begin repentance today. Nor should we delay in doing works of mercy and pursuing virtue because we will be called to give an account of what we have done with our lives. Remember that all the achievements that the Pharisee listed in the parable are not even mentioned in the parable of the Last Judgment. The Lord does not look for tithes or prayers, an exact keeping of the ceremonial law or any of the usual religious duties. When the Lord comes again he will be looking to see if he can recognize in us, His image. The Lord who is merciful and compassionate came to make us merciful and compassionate. We fast and pray, live a life obedient to the Gospel commands in order to soften our hearts and make us open to receive mercy and active to give mercy. "All the trees of the forest will exult before the face of the Lord, for He has come. He has come to judge the earth. "He has come the first time, and He will come again. At His first coming, His awn voice declared in the Gospel: Hereafter you shall see the Son of Man coming upon the clouds. What does He mean by hereafter? Does He not mean that the Lord will come at a future time when all the nations of the earth will be striking their breasts in grief? Previously He came through his preachers, and He filled the whole world. Let us not resist His first coming, so that we may not dread the second. What then should the Christian do? He ought to use the world, not become its slave. He will judge the world with equity and the peoples in His truth" What are equity and truth? He will gather

were unwilling to show mercy before the Judge 's coming. Those, however, who were willing to show mercy, will be judged with mercy. For it will be said to those placed on His right, "Come, blessed of My Father, take possession of the Kingdom which has been prepared for you from the beginning of the world" And He reckons to their account their works of mercy; "For I was hungry and you gave Me to eat; I was thirsty and you gave

Me to drink" (from a homily by St. Augustine of Hippo). Thus having been led and taught

by the Holy Fathers during these weeks prior to the Great Fast we will focus on what we

together with Him for the judgment His chosen ones, but the others He will set apart; for

He will place some on His right, others on His left. What is more equitable, what more

true than that they should not themselves expect mercy from the Judge, who themselves

know to be the sure path. We approach God with humility knowing that our sins are many and that the prayer of the Publican "Lord, be gracious to me a sinner" is the prayer that rises to heaven. This knowledge of our condition does not leave us in the dust of the pigpen. We forsake our former behavior and pleasures that do not satisfy. We make the long journey back to God through prayer and fasting, with tears and contrition and in the knowledge that we have a merciful Heavenly Father and a place in His kingdom. On this return we remember that there is urgency because the time is short. Along the way, we

who hope to receive mercy do not neglect to show mercy. It is our prayer that your tears

will be turned to joy and that your hearts be filled with hope as we make our journey from

death to life and from earth to heaven. May God give you a good repentance and open to

you the gates of Paradise.

Andrew is notified. It especially is important that a family member contact Fr. Andrew whenever a loved-one is hospitalized.

Parish Membership: We welcome anyone to become a parishioner of St. John the Baptist Cathedral Parish. Only those who are registered are considered members of the Parish. When one
