## Attentive to the Word

Feast of the Radiant Resurrection Acts 1: 1-8 John 1: 1-17

Christ Is Risen! What a glorious greeting! Glorious because it speaks only of glory our everlasting, unfading crown of glory! It speaks of the fulfillment of all that man longs for in this life!

The Easter, Paschal greeting: "Christ Is Risen!" was for the first time spoken by the angel to the women at our Lord's tomb, and the response: "Indeed, He Is Risen! It was first spoken by apostles when the news of Christ's resurrection reached them: "The Lord has been raised! It is true! He has appeared to Simon." (Lk. 24,34)

What joyful thoughts, what hope, what love, courage and strength should fill our hearts and minds upon hearing this greeting: "Christ Is Risen!"

For through His resurrection, Jesus Christ might "... free those who through fear of death had been slaves their whole life long" (Heb. 2,14); because of Christ's resurrection, our mortal bodies shall be clothed "with immortality" (d. 1 Cor. 15,52-54) and they "will shine like the sun in their Father's kingdom" (Mt 13,43); because of Christ's resurrection the sufferings of the "present are as nothing compared with the glory (of the resurrection) to be revealed to us." (Rom. 8,18)

Through the resurrection of Christ we shall all enter into a new life of which St. Paul says: "Eye has not seen nor ear heard, nor has it entered into the heart of man what things God has prepared for those who love him" (1 Cor. 2,9); we shall enter into a new life where God will dwell with us, where we will be "his people and he will be our God... He will wipe away all tears from our eyes, there will be no more death, no more mourning, nor weeping or pain, for all these things will have passed away." (Apoc. 21.3)

The resurrection of Christ is the foundation of our faith for "if Christ had not risen," says St. Paul, "vain is our preaching and vain is your faith." (1 Cor. 15,14)

Finally, and above all wonders and marvels, through the resurrection, we will deified; we shall become divine as was decreed by the Holy Trinity from all eternity - we shall be made like unto God in whose image and likeness we were created, according to the words of our Lord: "O Father most holy, ... that they may be one even as we are one (john 17,11) ... that they may be one, even as we are one as you Father, are in me, and I am in you (John 17,21) ... that they may be one as we are one." (John 17,22) St. Peter said: "... he has bestowed on us the great and precious things he promised so that through these you who have fled a world corrupted by lust might become sharers of the divine nature." St. Paul said that we shall see him "face to face", (1 Cor. 13,12) and know God as we are known; St. John also said: "We shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is." (1 John 3,2)

Mysteries of Initiation (Baptism, Chrismation & Eucharist): Must be a registered, active, supporting member of the parish family. Pre-baptism instructions are required. Contact Fr.

Andrew to schedule.

Mystery of Crowning: Must be a registered, active, supporting member of the parish family. Must meet with Fr. Andrew before setting date and reserving your banquet hall. Pre-Cana program is required and three sessions with Fr. Andrew. The ceremony will be celebrated according to the prescription of the liturgical book of the Byzantine rite.

Mystery of Reconciliation: Celebrated Saturdays, 4:00 PM - 4:30 PM and upon request.

**Mystery of Anointing:** Celebrated upon request. Ideally celebrated in Church the Sunday before undergoing any surgical or other medical procedure.

<u>Visitation of the Sick:</u> The parishioners confined to their homes or nursing homes due to health reasons are visited monthly. Also, persons who are hospitalized are visited when Fr. Andrew is notified. It especially is important that a family member contact Fr. Andrew whenever a loved-one

is hospitalized.

Funerals: Families of the deceased or the funeral director must contact Fr. Andrew before setting and publishing the day and time of the funeral.

Parish Membership: We welcome anyone to become a parishioner of St. John the Baptist Cathedral Parish. Only those who are registered are considered members of the Parish. When one registers to become a parish member they assume the responsibility of rendering stewardship of time, talent and treasure to this parish family. Worship at this parish is always expected. Registration is done only through the pastor by appointment. The Parish Office should be notified

as soon as possible of any change of address within the Parish as well as one's leaving.

**Godparent/Sponsor Letters:** Must be a registered, active, supporting member of the parish.

Rectory Office Hours: Judy is in the parish office Monday – Friday from 8:30 AM – 1:30 PM. Father Andrew is available on other days and times by appointment.
